His work focuses on the design, economics and function of organized ("day two") electricity markets, representing clients such as the American Forest & Paper Association, State industrial and trade groups, Demand Response providers and others before the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, Stakeholder bodies in RTOs and State Commissions.

Prior to joining Preti Flaherty, he worked for eight years as a staff attorney with the Maine Public Utilities Commission, a unique experience that afforded him an insider's understanding of complex utilities issues from consumer, corporate and governmental points of view. While at the commission, he played a significant role in the development of the "Commissioner's Draft Report on Restructuring the Electric Industry in Maine."

His primary responsibilities at the commission included natural gas issues, electric utility regulation, special rate-contract litigation, rate design and antitrust matters relevant to electric rate restructuring. He also served as an advocate and advisor in water utility regulation.

He is co-author of an article, published in 1995 in *Public Utilities Fortnightly*, titled "Guidelines for Granting Industrial 'Distress' Rate Discounts." Don is listed in Woodward/White's *The Best Lawyers in America* and also in *Chambers USA: America's Leading Lawyers for Business*.

He is a 1989 graduate of the University of Maine School of Law, from which he graduated fifth in a class of fifty-three. As a law student, he received several American Jurisprudence Awards in criminal procedure and antitrust while working full time as a gymnastics coach.
